Honeywell is committed to the responsible sourcing of 3TG throughout our global supply chain and to compliance with the Conflict Mineral Rules. Honeywell complies with all laws and regulations including those relating to potential economic sanction concerns within various countries.

Honeywell operates a comprehensive conflict minerals compliance program that addresses all regulated minerals (tin, tantalum, tungsten, gold). Cobalt and MICA has not been defined as a Conflict Mineral and is therefore not covered by any existing 'conflict minerals' regulation.

Honeywell Safety and Productivity Solutions does not purchase Cobalt, MICA, (or 3TG's) directly from mines, smelters, or refiners. Through our existing Conflict Mineral program, we have no reason to believe or suspect that materials in our supply chain are sourced directly or indirectly from any smelter of concern.

Our businesses and product designs do not directly specify the use of Cobalt or MICA – any Cobalt or MICA present in our products will be present in purchased materials for which Honeywell is considered a downstream user, as such we do not operate Cobalt or MICA transparency programs and are therefore, unable to provide the requested CRT or MRT at this time.
